TOPIC: RESTAGING AND CLEANUP GUIDELINES

INTRODUCTION: Plan for putting equipment back into staging after use

Immediately Restage Equipment that Does Not Need Cleanup or Repair

- Reduce Amount of Loose Equipment
- Check Equipment Back In To Service as Per Accountability System

Transport Equipment Back to Staging Area

- Keep Items Requiring Repair Separate from Serviceable Equipment
- Isolate Items Requiring Decontamination from Other Equipment
- Use Trash Bag for to Store Contaminated Equipment

Decontaminate Equipment – Decon – Hazmat Guidelines (Operations)**Report / Care for Damaged Equipment – Damaged or Lost Equipment Guidelines**

- Repair Items Immediately as Able – Cost Effectiveness Issue
- Prioritize Outstanding Repair Issues and Add to “Work – To Do List”

Log Use of Specialized Equipment as Needed – Motor Operation, Rope Use**Equipment Cleanup – Remove Dirt, Salt Water, Sweat, ...**

- End of Operational Period – Reusing Equipment Again Shortly
 - Clean Equipment as Able (Need to Have Adequate Drying Time)
 - Confirm Equipment Kits and Sets Previously Used Packed Correctly
 - Restage and Check Back Into Service

End of Operations – Equipment Back Into Longer Term Storage

- Clean PPE Using PPE Guidelines
- Clean Rope Using Rope Guidelines
- Clean Boats Using RIB, Firby Guidelines
- Clean General Equipment Using Mild Soap (Ivory) and Water

Hang To Dry As Able – Record Location on Accountability System

- Use Rescue Cage and Main Area (N-267) for Gross Drying
- Use Changing Room of Main Water Trailer for Longer Term

Maintenance / Restage on Dry Equipment Before Return to Service

- Follow Guidelines as Needed
- Restage and Check Back in Service
